Pentecost greetings to all of you,

## **Community Leadership Update**

The Leadership Team met together last month to continue its work toward securing taxexempt status for Sophia Christi as a 501c3. We celebrated our success in registering with the State of Oregon as a non-profit religious organization and completed work on our By-laws with the guidance and assistance (I'm convinced) of Holy Wisdom. There is much left to be done as we create a narrative description of who we are for the IRS and come up with a preliminary budget that takes into account the needs of both the Eugene and Portland hubs of our larger community. We hope to be finished with this process by the end of the year. If you have expertise in this area or would like to contribute some of your talent to the leadership of Sophia Christi, please let me know. The Eugene portion of the community is well-represented on the Leadership Team but **we could use** another member from Portland. Please prayerfully consider becoming more involved in developing the structure and vision of our faith community.

# **Pastoral Update**

As we move forward on the leadership tasks outlined above, I find myself looking back on the **dreams and needs** many of you articulated so well at our Community Meetings in 2009. Many of those dreams are based on parish models where long-time, committed members, well-established parish programs and salaried priests/parish administrators have kept things moving week-to-week and month-to-month year after year for decades. We have been in the process of creating a new community and a new model, which is always a challenge, with only each other and the Spirit for encouragement of our efforts, and no financial base of support for visions and desires that require additional time, energy and space to succeed. Given that reality, we have accomplished amazing things these last 4 years! And every month new people find their way to our door, hungry for hope and for spiritual nourishment—and most leave with tears of gratitude, having been well-fed, promising to return.

I'm aware, however, that some of the spiritual needs mentioned in those earlier discussions haven't yet been addressed. There were several requests for more than one Mass each month, for example, and we are on our way to having that option as a full community in Portland by the end of the summer. Prior to that, I invite anyone willing to host a **home Mass** to contact me. We can celebrate Liturgy in a more intimate setting, and you can invite other Sophia Christi members as well as friends and family to join you. This could compliment our larger Liturgies and feed the community in a different way, and you can be as involved (or not) in choosing readings and music for the occasion. Email me if you have an interest in pursuing this option.

Additionally, we will be offering a **Spiritually-focused retreat** sometime this Fall. Once the location has been determined and dates nailed down (hopefully by next month) I will let you know and you can reserve space on your calendar for the event.

Some of you requested that we offer groups focused on faith-sharing, study, prayer or spiritual direction. Next weekend you will find sign-up sheets at our Masses for those interested in one or more of these groups. Depending on interest, we would like to begin offering **group spiritual direction** and possibly one other weekly group experience this summer. Please look for the sign-up sheets at the back of the church. If you aren't able to come to the Pentecost Liturgy and you are interested in one of these offerings, just let

me know and I will add your name to the list. If there are other spiritual needs not addressed here that you would like me to be aware of, please don't hesitate to contact me at any time. You have my email address in this mailing, and my phone number is 503-286-3584.

### Food for the Poor

We received the following message from Kathleen Green, Director of the St. Andrew Food Pantry, in response to our May contribution to the Pantry:

### **Portland PRIDE**

Portland's Gay Pride Festival is coming up on June 18 and 19, with the parade scheduled to begin at 11:30 on the 19<sup>th</sup>. Sophia Christi will be marching with the Catholic Coalition of the Community of Welcoming Congregations and I invite all of you to participate. Well over half of those stopping by the CWC booth at Pride are Catholics according to Tara Wilkins, executive director of CWC. Given the painful anti-gay stance of our Church, the Catholic presence at Pride is especially important. Next year, I hope, we can have a banner of our own in the parade, and maybe even a booth at the festival!

There are many things happening, as you can see, and still more in process. Please join me in praying for our community, that we may be inspired, formed, guided and protected by the Holy Spirit during this, Her season. Through its very existence Sophia Christi provides a beacon of hope for many who feel abandoned by a punitive, dismissive and autocratic mentality within the institutional church. There are few oases

of healing and encouragement for those who have left or are leaving in despair. A strong Sophia Christi community provides a harbor for these weary souls who deserve pastoral care, sacramental nourishment and a place of welcome. This is a large part of our mission. May the Spirit be with us and bless our small efforts to be that place of welcome around the Table Jesus sets for the spiritually hungry of our world.
